#### Trustees

Happy New Year! The Trustees met on December 10, 2019. The financials were presented by Alan C with minor corrections that were accepted. All financial information has been transferred to Burt which will be looked at and filed. Burt is still working on QuickBooks. They are still looking for 2018 information that is not necessary.

The Rev. Bob Naylor was scheduled to meet with a small group of Trustees and Diaconate to discuss the healing process for the church. The conference will pay for this counseling. Rev Meade will be with us through June unless a settled pastor is found. The search is waiting for more candidates.

CNK is managing through the illness of Jean Holland.

Parsonage work has slowed down at this time, we still have a lot of work to complete. The plywood that was stored there has disappeared, we will be looking into that. Accessories are in the process of being bought to make the parsonage livable in case Rev. Meade needs to be there or our settled Pastor. The Thrift Shop has been very generous giving us items for the parsonage, Thank You Judy! Electrical work will be done this month, 35 electrical plugs will be replaced, installation of a mirror and a light over the vanity in the upstairs bathroom. After the holiday we will continue with the remaining issues. Updates need to be added to the spreadsheet. The sanctuary ceiling painting is progressing with contacting more companies.

All functions of the church that require funding will first go to the event committee to determine costs/profit, etc. and then to the council for final approval. The committee running the event will then proceed. No function will take place without council's approval. You can find the fundraising kit in the church office.

Budgets and Annual Reports need to be finalized and in by January 8, 2020, so that they will be ready for the congregation 2 weeks prior to the Annual Meeting scheduled for January 26, 2020. Follow up on the fire alarm system, cameras, sign, CPC, etc. is ongoing. Trustees next meeting is January 20, 2020
